## Update from The Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians

As we enter the final few weeks of the 2020 school year, it is wonderful to see that the vast majority of students are still attending school and engaged in important work in preparation for 2021. Our Year 11 students finish up today and their Semester Two School Reports were emailed on 18th November, and are also available on Connect. School Reports for students in Years 7-10 will be emailed, and available on Connect, on 18th December. These reports provide students with an opportunity to reflect on their progress and achievement and to set goals for 2021.

Year 7-10 students will also receive their Yearbooks (Scimitar 2020) in the last two weeks of the year and hopefully they will enjoy reading through the activities and events of 2020. Year 11 students and those who are absent will receive their copies of the Yearbook at the beginning of the new school year.

### Problems with Internet and Phones

On Wednesday morning one of the contractors working on Links Road cut the main internet fibre cable to the school resulting in the loss of both the internet and phone system. 
### Year 10 Exams – Pathways for 2021

Our Year 10 students have just completed their Semester 2 exams for this year. **The most important aspect** of sitting significant assessments (such as exams) is to reflect and review their individual performance and **highlight and address areas for improvement**. This is now an ideal time to focus on the feedback provided by teachers following the marking of exams.

Students who are moving into an ATAR pathway for 2021 should pay particular attention to their feedback and actively reflect on their performance. We strongly advise all students to examine their results and whether the pathway they have chosen for next year is consistent with their performance.

Mr Lilleyman and I will be analysing the Semester 2 results and where necessary, we will be inviting students for a meeting to discuss areas of concern. If students wish to independently discuss their current results and course/ subject choices for next year, please encourage them to come and see either Mr Lilleyman or me during break times.

It has been pleasing to hear that many students have made adjustments to the way they study, based on the Study Hacks sessions they have attended throughout Semester 2. Replacing old study with effective study habits is the first step to achieving success in Senior School.

## School Board Report

At the last School Board meeting on Thursday the 19th of November, a new community board member was elected. Congratulations to Andrew Dwyer who will commence his term in 2021. Andrew brings a wealth of experience in strategy, transformation, and finance, as well as being an active volunteer for local community organisations including the Applecross Mount Pleasant Junior Football Club.



### Thanks

We would like to thank Kylie Dobson, community representative and 2020 secretary, and Darrin Richards, P & C representative, who finish their terms at the end of this year. Mike Bracher has been re-elected to Chair of the Board in 2021 and Damien Ewington has taken on the role of secretary.

### School review update and priorities

Deputy Principal Paul Currie presented an update on the 2022 Business Plan, highlighting the role of the 2020 staff, parent and student surveys and subsequent student focus groups in providing feedback into areas for improvement. Focus has been placed on where there were the biggest gaps between staff and student opinions. The board commended the school in undertaking the surveys in 2020, in what has been a challenging year, where school surveys were not deemed compulsory and many schools opted out of the process.

Term 4 continues to be a time for planning with Heads of Learning Areas addressing areas for improvement and working with their teams to implement suggestions and student insights for 2021. Recommendations have been targeted to the three key priorities in the School's Business Plan being Student Development and Wellbeing, Excellence in Teaching and Learning and Literacy. Actions have been planned against each priority, with many already underway in 2020 including further development of the House system and increases in positive behaviour reporting. The school is also working on greater collaboration with its feeder primary schools and recently hosted a networking event to share and discuss assessments with the aim to align and close any gaps that may affect the transition into high school.

### Finance update

The Board noted the 2021 proposed budget and priorities. Financial planning has been undertaken on a student enrolment estimate of 1705. A sample of approved finance submissions that were noted include updating of out of warranty computers, new Science UV sterilisation cabinets, a security camera for the bike rack and new circus skills equipment for Year 7 drama. The School Board has one last get together in December, providing an opportunity to meet new 2021 members and thank departing members for their contributions, in what has been a challenging yet rewarding year for the Applecross Senior High School community.

The aim is to provide good quality uniforms that are no longer required at a flat fee. The funds generated will be used to support the provision of health and wellbeing services to our students.

As this is an online shop only, there are no facilities for trying on uniforms for sizing. **Please ensure you note the student name and Care Group ID.**

We have sorted clothing into those items that are a very good to excellent condition, and those that are good. The good have no damage but may be more faded and have a small mark or stain. We do not have clothing that is torn or where buttons are missing or zips broken. We do not have excessively faded items or those with quite obvious marks/stains. At times there may be individual items listed where there is a photo that identifies a mark that is noticeable but not maybe in a prominent spot. The second hand uniform volunteers take care in sorting garments appropriately, but there may be items overlooked. Also keep in mind that dye lots and cloth batches can vary from run to run - red shirts notoriously change shades of red from one batch to the next.





## Spotlight on the Government Agency Work Placement Register

The Work Placement Register provides an online platform for Year 11 and 12 students to access work placement opportunities in government agencies. It has been primarily developed for public school secondary students undertaking nationally recognised training, to provide them with the opportunity to apply their skills in real work contexts across a range of Western Australian government agencies.

The Work Placement Register has been developed using the same platform and management system as the WA public sector's Jobs WA website. The Recruitment Advertisement Management System (RAMS) is used by government agencies to advertise work placement vacancies on the Work Placement Register jobs board.

Come along to our meetings held on Tuesdays at 15:30 in S207, Weeks 3 and 7 of each term.


Our first meeting for next year is on Tuesday the 16th Feb. You're welcome to attend and help set up some projects for the year!
