

Student Information Management System - SEQTA and Connect

As you are probably aware, the school has been transitioning from CONNECT to SEQTA as a student information management system. From 2023, all reporting in Lower School will be via SEQTA. Unfortunately, due to unforeseen circumstances, this transition will be longer for students in Years 11 and 12. This means that student results in Senior School will still be accessed via CONNECT. Some teachers may, however, utilise SEQTA to provide additional feedback. Parents will be able to access this feedback but should rely on CONNECT for the accurate reporting of results.

In Senior School, CONNECT will remain the primary means of communicating student results for the foreseeable future. There will be occasions when we also use SEQTA to provide additional feedback. Staff are not required to use SEQTA and may not employ it consistently. Individual teachers will inform students when there is additional feedback on SEQTA.



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Sextortion

The Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation is here to keep children and young people safe from online sexual exploitation and abuse

























The Australian Federal Police through the Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation is seeing a concerning global trend of teenage males being targeted to send explicit images of themselves and then blackmailed. This is called sexual extortion or sextortion.

The AFP is urging families to have important safety conversations before the school holidays to prevent young people from becoming victims. This crime can have serious wellbeing and psychological impacts.

How does sextortion start?

- Unsolicited friend and follow requests on social media
- Direct messages on one app and then being asked to keep chatting on a secondary app
- Conversations suddenly and quickly becoming sexualised
- Requests for sexualised images or content.

What can families do?

- Have open and regular conversations about your child's online activities and interactions
- Know what platforms, apps and games they are using and who they are interacting with
- Remain open and approachable. Victims will be reluctant to come forward if they feel they will be punished or blamed
- Ensure your child knows that it is okay to leave conversations if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe
- Support your child and know how to respond. The Online blackmail and sexual extortion response kit have been created to recognise sextortion and get help.

This month on SchoolTV - Bullying by SchoolTV

Bullying is an ongoing or repeated misuse of power in relationships with the intention to cause deliberate psychological harm. Bullying behaviours can be verbal, physical or social. It can happen in person or online via various digital platforms and devices and can be obvious or hidden. Bullying in any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including

Despite efforts to reduce bullying behaviours, the research tells us that one in four students still report being bullied every few weeks. However, not all negative behaviour should be considered bullying. The key difference is that bullying does not stop on its own. It's important young people learn how to identify behaviours that are rude, behaviours that are mean, and behaviours that are related to bullying.



Often the reasons for bullying can be complex. Some young people do it to get approval from others, some do it to regain control, whilst others may do it because it makes them feel safe. Supporting young people as they work through their emotions will help them unpack the motivation and reason behind the behaviour.

In this edition of SchoolTV, caregivers can better understand why some young people engage in bullying behaviours and what to do to support a child experiencing it. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition and always welcome your feedback.



The AXSHS P&C are looking for Parents and interested Community members to work as part of our dynamic team to support the school community. We are looking for new general P&C members and those who might be interested in taking on a more specific role for 2023, including President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.

As high school P&Cs are quite different to primary school P&Cs, a quick overview of their roles is as follows:-

President- this role involves chairing general P&C meetings (only four each year) and chairing Executive Committee meetings only when necessary. An excellent grasp or quick learning of the WACSSO and our constitution is imperative to success, and knowledge of basic IT and social media would be beneficial. Our President is also a part of the banking signatory team, needing to be able to sign off on payments when necessary electronically. Leading a busy team of volunteer members, you will need to have the ability to be able to oversee all of our sub-committee's work, without being responsible for it, along with an ability to run succinct, productive meetings without necessarily rushing people through and try and engage the P&C group as a whole to support our school community.

Vice President - this role involves supporting our President and being available to chair any meetings should the need arise, along with being the WACSSO Liaison and attending the annual WACSSO conference. Being another electronic payment signatory is also necessary, along with a good grasp and familiarity of ours and WACSSO's constitution. Secretary - this is the meeting minute taker role and is suited to whoever can concisely and accurately take all meeting minutes, along with the ability to collate and disseminate them in a timely manner after each meeting. An excellent grasp of the rules and procedures that govern a P&C needs to be acquired, as it is essential for such a large P&C budget to be administered with good governance. This role includes

Treasurer - this is perhaps the most important role of our particular P&C, as we have such a large budget to administer and disseminate according to the P&C member's and the school's wishes. We have a large canteen, accounted electronically on MYOB, and excellent knowledge of that system is essential for our Treasurer. Our P&C has chosen to employ a bookkeeper to support the Treasurer, making the role much more manageable.

Other roles - there are plenty of different positions in our P&C to be filled if you don't feel like putting your hand up for one of the 'Big 4'. We have a number of committees (Special Tennis, Special Art, music, Fathering Project) and another unofficial role that we have been wanting to fill for a number of years - PR liaison. This would suit a person very familiar with and able to write social media posts, newspaper articles and Parent Update articles for the P&C and any sub-committees that require this service and submit them to the Principal's PA for submission to the various outlets the school has online and in the media. We aren't sure how involved this role might get, but we would love to hear from anyone interested in giving it a go. We would also love to hear from anyone who has grant writing experience, as that is an area that we are needing more expertise in as well. We must stress ALL press of any sort has to be vetted by the school first, with no exceptions.

General membership - being a member of our P&C allows you to have meaningful input into the decisions made about what we do with the funds we generate each year, which in such a large school is substantial. We allocate most of the yearly funds to projects the group hopes will benefit the most students, and you can have a role in those decisions.

This is not only an AGM but a social get-together where you can meet other P&C members and the current committee members, ask questions and think about how you can support our school. The P&C has supported many programs, including the CORE Camp, Chaplain, the Fathering Project, building the bike enclosure and running the Bike Safety Inspections, as well as contributing towards the Hospitality Café (construction starting soon).
