## Update from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Three weeks into the new school year and we have now settled into a very positive and productive learning routine. I have been impressed by how quickly the Year 7's and the other new students in Years 8-12 have fitted in and become part of the Applecross SHS community. Seeing our Year 12 students enjoy themselves and behave superbly at the School Ball last Friday evening at Optus Stadium was wonderful. We received numerous comments from the staff in attendance that our students were most polite, courteous and well behaved of any other school they have worked in. These comments reflect the feedback that we are receiving from our new staff members about all our students. So well done, students. What a great place Applecross SHS is to work at.

### P&C AGM/Sundowner (Thursday 9th March)

A reminder that our annual Parent Mixer event is coming up fast and that you will need to [RSVP by Monday 6th, March](#). Strong parent involvement and support are key reasons Applecross SHS is such an effective and highly functioning school. We are in great need of parent assistance in 2023 either as volunteers in our sub-committees (Art, Tennis, Canteen or Music) or as P&C position holders. ### Road Safety

The beginning of the new school year is always particularly busy and dangerous on surrounding roads as more parents drive students to and from school than usual. Unfortunately, some parents contribute to other motorists' frustration and the risk to students. These behaviours include ignoring road rules by illegally double parking, doing U-turns and other unsafe driving practices. I urge all parents to use extreme care, patience and courtesy when picking up or dropping off students. It would also assist if you could try to avoid the most congested areas immediately outside the school gates. A 5-minute walk will have health and social benefits for the students and will also reduce parental stress.

### Ardessie Street

In previous years there were concerns that the behaviour of motorists on Ardessie Street (in particular) was contributing both to congestion and the risk to pedestrians. There is a drop-off zone that is clearly marked as such, but it may not always be visible if parents have parked in the area. Please ensure that you do not park in the 'drive through' parking area as this holds up other parents and contributes to the congestion and frustration of other motorists. Parents are also asked not to enter staff car parks that are accessible from Ardessie Street when dropping off or collecting their children. The school's visitor bays are located on Links Road, and the carpark on Ardessie Street is for staff only.

### City of Melville Rangers

The City of Melville called the school to advise that the Rangers will be doing increased patrols on surrounding roads over the coming weeks. They have received several complaints from residents around all our bordering streets.

They have suggested that parents are advised that they will be patrolling in the morning and afternoon.

After Friday 24 March, no student may change into another course in Year 12. Any student considering this option must do so soon and seek advice from either Ms Jones or Mrs Casserly as soon as possible.

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## Year 12 Non-School Candidate Language Applications

Any Year 12 ATAR student wishing to sit the external languages WACE exam as a non-school candidate **must see Ms Jones for information on how to apply by Friday 3 March**. There are strict rules associated with these examinations and if you are considering sitting the exam, you will need to ensure you meet the criteria. All applications are due with payment to SCSA by 23 March. No late applications will be accepted.



If students are applying for a '**background language**' course, there is a considerable amount of work required prior to submitting the application to determine whether the student is eligible. Therefore, this needs to be discussed individually with Ms Jones in as soon as practicable to ensure deadlines and criteria can be met.

**Please note:** As a non-school candidate, that examination does not contribute towards meeting the requirements for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

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## NAPLAN - Preparation in English

Preparing students for **NAPLAN** in Years 7 and 9 English has traditionally been a difficult, almost ad hoc process that has consumed a great deal of class time. For the last couple of years, the English Department has been using *Education Perfect* to streamline this process. Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 undergo a series of pre and post tests on NAPLAN related skills and knowledge. After each test, the program evaluates each student's strengths and weaknesses and assigns a range of activities to bolster areas of weakness. In effect, this becomes the students' homework program, personalised to each individual student.



Parents can support teachers (and their child) by monitoring this homework. Some students are a bit hesitant to complete their homework and thus jeopardise their success at NAPLAN. Please ask your child to show you how they are progressing through the assigned activities. If they are 'reluctant', contact your child's English teacher and they can provide you with the log on details.

Education Perfect has played a significant part in improving the school's NAPLAN results, as well as providing a relevant and personalised homework program for each student. A little parental scrutiny will ensure your child's continued success and build a sound foundation for the study of English in the senior years of school.

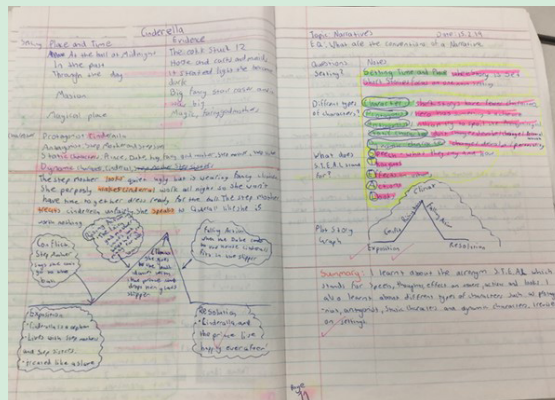
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## Learning to Learn - Years 7 to 9

Good notetaking is an essential skill for success. Just like playing a sport or an instrument, being able to take good notes, and use them effectively, requires practice.

In explicitly teaching effective note taking we use a focused notetaking (FNT) process which has five phases.



### Cornell Notes

One of the note-taking formats your child uses is referred to as *Cornell Notes*. This format helps your child stay organised and provides them with space to work through the note taking process. It should include the topic of the day, the Essential Question (the learning intention), a column for thinking beyond the notes, and an area for a summary.

This initiative is to help reduce the plastic pollution as we come into line with the WA Government's *Plan for Plastics*.

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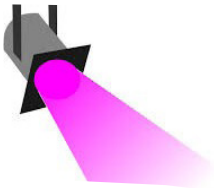
# EYES on VET

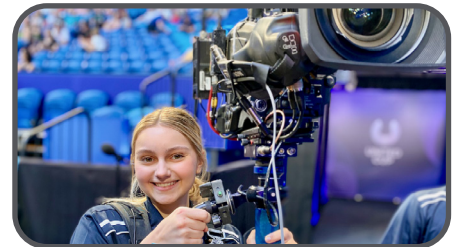

to be acquired, as it is essential for such a large P&C budget to be administered with good governance. This role includes all correspondence and supporting the board members and sub-committees to carry out their roles. Strong written communication skills and basic computing skills are helpful.

**Treasurer** - this is perhaps the most important role of our particular P&C, as we have such a large budget to administer and disseminate according to the P&C member's and the school's wishes. We have a large canteen, accounted electronically on MYOB, and excellent knowledge of that system is essential for our Treasurer. Our P&C has chosen to employ a bookkeeper to support the Treasurer, making the role much more manageable.

**Other roles** - there are plenty of different positions in our P&C to be filled if you don't feel like putting your hand up for one of the 'Big 4'. We have a number of committees ( Special Tennis, Special Art, music, Fathering Project) and another unofficial role that we have been wanting to fill for a number of years - PR liaison. This would suit a person very familiar with and able to write social media posts, newspaper articles and Parent Update articles for the P&C and any sub-committees that require this service and submit them to the Principal's PA for submission to the various outlets the school has online and in the media. We aren't sure how involved this role might get, but we would love to hear from anyone interested in giving it a go. We would also love to hear from anyone who has grant writing experience, as that is an area that we are needing more expertise in as well. We must stress ALL press of any sort has to be vetted by the school first, with no exceptions.

**General membership** - being a member of our P&C allows you to have meaningful input into the decisions made about what we do with the funds we generate each year, which in such a large school is substantial. We allocate most of the yearly funds to projects the group hopes will benefit the most students, and you can have a role in those decisions.

This is not only an AGM but a social get-together where you can meet other P&C members and the current committee members, ask questions and think about how you can support our school. The P&C has supported many programs, including the CORE Camp, Chaplain, the Fathering Project, building the bike enclosure and running the Bike Safety Inspections, as well as contributing towards the Hospitality Café (construction starting soon).

The AXSHS P&C are looking for Parents and interested Community members to work as part of our dynamic team to support the school community. We are looking for new general P&C members and those who might be interested in taking on a more specific role for 2023, including President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.

As high school P&Cs are quite different to primary school P&Cs, a quick overview of their roles is as follows:-

**President**- this role involves chairing general P&C meetings (only four each year) and chairing Executive Committee meetings only when necessary. An excellent grasp or quick learning of the WACSSO and our constitution is imperative to success, and knowledge of basic IT and social media would be beneficial. Our President is also a part of the banking signatory team, needing to be able to sign off on payments when necessary electronically. Leading a busy team of volunteer members, you will need to have the ability to be able to oversee all of our sub-committee's work, without being responsible for it, along with an ability to run succinct, productive meetings without necessarily rushing people through and try and engage the P&C group as a whole to support our school community.

**Vice President** - this role involves supporting our President and being available to chair any meetings should the need arise, along with being the WACSSO Liaison and attending the annual WACSSO conference. Being another electronic payment signatory is also necessary, along with a good grasp and familiarity of ours and WACSSO's constitution.

**Secretary** - this is the meeting minute taker role and is suited to whoever can concisely and accurately take all meeting minutes, along with the ability to collate and disseminate them in a timely manner after each meeting. An excellent grasp of the rules and procedures that govern a P&C needs

### Physics Primer

Students perform calculations to solve problems of motion, including gravity and then other forces in the universe. Students may also train for the Australian Science Olympiads Examination for Physics and/or the Open Universities Australia units General Physics and/or Principles of Physics.

### Chemistry Primer

Students perform calculations to learn about atoms, molecules, elements and compounds and progress to calculations in topics such as gases, specific heat and chemical solutions. Students may also train for the Australian Science Olympiads Examination for Chemistry and/or the Open Universities Australia unit Fundamentals of Chemistry.

### Mathematics Primer

Fridays 4:30 - 6:30pm

Students consolidate their Arithmetic and will be introduced to Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry followed by Calculus and other areas when required. Mathematical topics are taught at each student's pace and students learn mathematical conventions and techniques.

All classes are at Murdoch University, South Street Campus. Sessions are tailored to each individual student and students may begin at any time during the term.

Classes commence the second week of each school term. All subjects require a notebook for working, and will require a scientific calculator. Bottled water is permitted in classrooms and students should bring a healthy snack.
