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NAPLAN Online (Years 7 and 9)

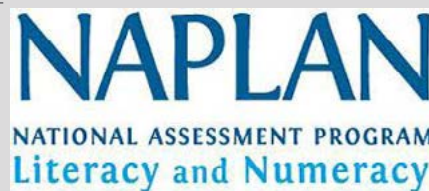

The National Assessment Program testing period will fall between Wednesday, 15th March (Week 7) – Monday, 27th March (Week 9) 2023. Parents are requested, where possible, to ensure that no family holidays or other absences occur during this fortnight.

In the lead-up to NAPLAN, you will receive various information from your child's classroom teachers, Anna Edwards (Literacy Support Coordinator) and myself regarding how to prepare for the assessment period. I am working with Anna Edwards to ensure all students are ready for NAPLAN, as are teachers. 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School Board Meeting Summary

On behalf of the Applecross Senior High School Board, we extend a warm welcome to all our new and returning students and staff for 2023. The Board held their first meeting for 2023 in person on Thursday, 23rd February. As always, our first annual meeting generally involves a full agenda, as we covered many business areas, including welcoming our two new board members and our 2023 Student Council Representatives.

An in-depth presentation of the 2022 Year 12 WACE Results was provided by the Associate Principal for Years 10-12, Ms Toni Jones, which highlighted the outstanding achievements of our departing Year 12 graduates. The school is to be congratulated on the fantastic results, which reflect the consolidated program of improvement that has been occurring for the last seven years. Some highlights include:

- ★ Excellent WACE Achievement 99.60%
- ★ 60% of students in the Top 10% of WA
- ★ Median ATAR of 91.20
- ★ Equal Top Public School VET Excellence Awards
- ★ 4 VET Certificate of Excellence

The Principal provided updates on a number of areas, including the progress of the Annual Report; the 2023-2025 School Business Plan (which was endorsed by the Board); changes to staff, and other school matters. The Principal reports that 2023 has been the most positive start to the school in a number of years, with a "great vibe" from both staff and students. It was also noted that Applecross Senior High School was selected from over 200 schools to participate in the 'Teaching for Impact' program.

A discussion was held around the upcoming 2023 School Review conducted by the Education Department on Tuesday, 21st March. The Department of Education's Public School Accountability directorate reviews all Western Australian public schools. A review gives assurance to the local community, the Minister for Education and Training and the Director General about the performance of public schools in delivering high-quality education to students. The review acknowledges the school's achievements and gives feedback to support the Principal and staff with their improvement planning. The Board heard from our Student Council, who informed us of the success of the Year 12 Ball, along with updates on planned events, future ideas and some general feedback.

In closing, the Chairperson highlighted a 50% growth in student numbers in the last 7-8 years and the need for the Board to conduct the necessary research to quantify and facilitate expected future student growth in order to make plans for future funding, growth and building expansion.

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Year 12 Non-School Candidate Language Applications

Any Year 12 ATAR student wishing to sit the external languages WACE exam as a non-school candidate **must see Ms Jones for information on how to apply by Friday, 10 March**. There are strict rules associated with these examinations, and if you are considering sitting the exam, you will need to ensure you meet the criteria. All applications are due with payment to SCISA by Thursday, 23 March. No late applications will be accepted.

If students are applying for a **'background language'** course, a considerable amount of work is required before submitting the application to determine whether the student is eligible. Therefore, this needs to be discussed individually with Ms Jones soon to ensure deadlines and criteria can be met.

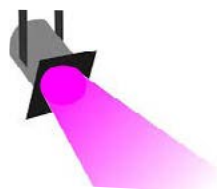
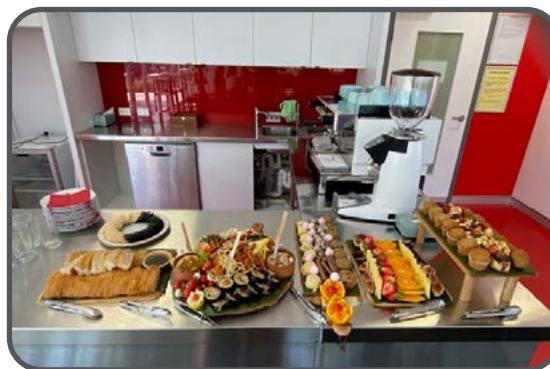

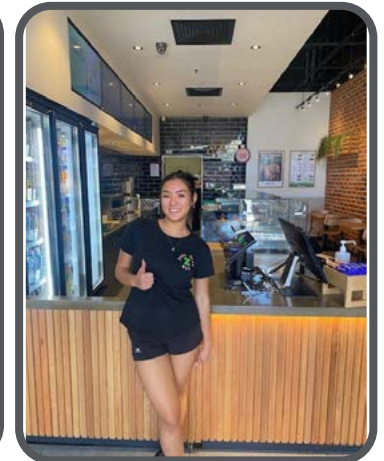

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Learning to Learn: Years 7-9

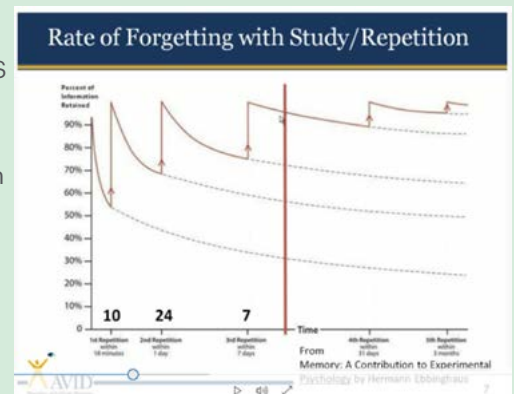

The Power of Revision

Effective learning requires the ongoing revision of class notes and new material. Research clearly indicates that spaced revision has a significant impact on what is remembered and, therefore, what can be applied. At AXSHS we promote the 10:24:7 revisitation guideline (10 mins, 24 hours, 7 days). The graph illustrates the impact these revisitations have on the percentage of information retained. It also illustrates how much is forgotten if the material or the day's learning is not revisited. Some of these revisitations will happen in class, but you can help by encouraging your child to revise at home.

How can I help my child to revise?

1. Ask to see your child's Interactive Notebook and ask them questions.
2. Ask them to tell you what they learned today or this week.
3. Ask them to teach you something.
4. Work with them to make quiz cards or use a quizzing software program, like Quizzlet.

to be acquired, as it is essential for such a large P&C budget to be administered with good governance. This role includes all correspondence and supporting the board members and sub-committees to carry out their roles. Strong written communication skills and basic computing skills are helpful.

Treasurer - this is perhaps the most important role of our particular P&C, as we have such a large budget to administer and disseminate according to the P&C member's and the school's wishes. We have a large canteen, accounted electronically on MYOB, and excellent knowledge of that system is essential for our Treasurer. Our P&C has chosen to employ a bookkeeper to support the Treasurer, making the role much more manageable.

Other roles - there are plenty of different positions in our P&C to be filled if you don't feel like putting your hand up for one of the 'Big 4'. We have a number of committees (Special Tennis, Special Art, music, Fathering Project) and another unofficial role that we have been wanting to fill for a number of years - PR liaison. This would suit a person very familiar with and able to write social media posts, newspaper articles and Parent Update articles for the P&C and any sub-committees that require this service and submit them to the Principal's PA for submission to the various outlets the school has online and in the media. We aren't sure how involved this role might get, but we would love to hear from anyone interested in giving it a go. We would also love to hear from anyone who has grant writing experience, as that is an area that we are needing more expertise in as well. We must stress ALL press of any sort has to be vetted by the school first, with no exceptions.

General membership - being a member of our P&C allows you to have meaningful input into the decisions made about what we do with the funds we generate each year, which in such a large school is substantial. We allocate most of the yearly funds to projects the group hopes will benefit the most students, and you can have a role in those decisions.

This is not only an AGM but a social get-together where you can meet other P&C members and the current committee members, ask questions and think about how you can support our school. The P&C has supported many programs, including the CORE Camp, Chaplain, the Fathering Project, building the bike enclosure and running the Bike Safety Inspections, as well as contributing towards the Hospitality Café (construction starting soon).

The AXSHS P&C are looking for Parents and interested Community members to work as part of our dynamic team to support the school community. We are looking for new general P&C members and those who might be interested in taking on a more specific role for 2023, including President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.

As high school P&Cs are quite different to primary school P&Cs, a quick overview of their roles is as follows:-

President - this role involves chairing general P&C meetings (only four each year) and chairing Executive Committee meetings only when necessary. An excellent grasp or quick learning of the WACSSO and our constitution is imperative to success, and knowledge of basic IT and social media would be beneficial. Our President is also a part of the banking signatory team, needing to be able to sign off on payments when necessary electronically. Leading a busy team of volunteer members, you will need to have the ability to be able to oversee all of our sub-committee's work, without being responsible for it, along with an ability to run succinct, productive meetings without necessarily rushing people through and try and engage the P&C group as a whole to support our school community.

Vice President - this role involves supporting our President and being available to chair any meetings should the need arise, along with being the WACSSO Liaison and attending the annual WACSSO conference. Being another electronic payment signatory is also necessary, along with a good grasp and familiarity of ours and WACSSO's constitution. Secretary - this is the meeting minute taker role and is suited to whoever can concisely and accurately take all meeting minutes, along with the ability to collate and disseminate them in a timely manner after each meeting. An excellent grasp of the rules and procedures that govern a P&C needs
