Update from the Principal

Dear Parents / Guardians

As we near the end of Term 2, the school is very busy, with many final assessments in the lead-up to the semester reports, subject selections for next year and the usual array of exciting student activities.

Semester One Reports

These reports allow parents to discuss with their child/ren how they are going (positives, challenges and where improvement is required). It is important that each student takes the opportunity to reflect on their progress and achievement, and parents can play an important role in this process. Term 3 Day 1 for Students

A reminder that the final designated School Development Day for 2023 will occur on the first day of Term 3 (Monday, 17th July), meaning that students recommence school in Term 3 on Tuesday, 18th July.

School tours and feedback

We have had over 150 prospective parents touring our facilities and enjoying a morning tea Q&A with key Student Services staff. The response has been overwhelmingly positive. Typical comments have been about how well-behaved the students are, how well-run the classrooms are, and how engaging the lessons are. The parents also commented on the amazing environment. Many parents had travelled far away to attend this and had participated in many other public and private tours. We are by far the most popular school of choice for all of them.



Subject Selections 2024

The 2024 timetable is well underway, with all Years 7 to 9 completing their subject selections recently. Year 10s will attend course counselling to select their Year 11 subjects over the next two weeks. Once all students' subject selections are completed, the 2024 staffing profile will be conducted for staff recruitment.

STEM superstar

We have been given a wonderful opportunity for our Year 10 girls to attend a talk on Thursday, 29th June, presented by Dr Karen Livesey. Karen is an ex-student who has been named the National STEM superstar and is visiting our school as part of her role in promoting STEM careers to girls.

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Year 12 WACE Exams

The Year 12 WACE Exam timetable is now available on the School Curriculum and Standards Authority website. Alternatively, enter WACE Exam Timetables 2023 into whatever search engine you use, and the timetable site will show up immediately. These exams are now set and cannot be changed under any circumstances.

Sometimes students will have two exams in one day. This is just the way it is and why we have a similar timetable during Years 11 and 12 so that students have experience in this. The school cannot change exam times, and the School Curriculum and Standards Authority won't enter into a debate on changing this timetable either.



Later in the year, students will be provided with a Personalised Exam Timetable which they will need to bring to each WACE Exams. More information on this will be provided closer to the exam dates.

Please remember that students must sit all exams if enrolled in an ATAR course. It doesn't matter if they have only one ATAR course. You MUST sit the WACE exam. Failure to do this puts a student's WACE achievement at serious risk.


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Learning to Learn

Note-Taking

It sounds easy, but it's actually quite a complex skill that consists of the five phases below. We explicitly teach the note-taking process because it is so essential to learning. Over the next few months, I will provide a brief summary of each phase.



Phase 2: Processing Notes

This phase facilitates the retention and understanding of information by requiring students to manipulate their notes in various ways. They will be asked to revisit notes to chunk, question, add and clarify. They will process new information by identifying, selecting, sorting, organising, classifying and evaluating main and supporting ideas. It is in this phase that students begin to interact with their notes and take ownership of the knowledge.

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SPECIAL REPORT - Mobile Phone Separation Anxiety

The use of mobile phones and technology in schools has been a highly debated topic internationally, including in Australia. Almost all states and territories in Australia, have implemented full bans on mobile phones during class, recess, and lunch times, while allowing students to carry their phones during travel to and from school.

Critics argue that there is no evidence supporting the effectiveness of such bans, but this is a mischaracterisation. Studies have shown the positive impacts of mobile phone bans in schools. One study conducted in 2016, found that banning mobile phones led to an increase in student performance, with test scores improving by 6.4% of a standard deviation. Similar studies from Spain and Norway also supported these findings.



For parents concerned about mobile phone separation anxiety in their children, it is important to acknowledge it as a real issue and discuss the negative effects of phone addiction, such as sleep problems and mental health issues. Gradually introducing phone-free periods at home, setting clear expectations and boundaries and modelling healthy behaviours can help your child cope. It is also crucial to establish a support network and seek professional help if needed. Implementing mobile phone bans in schools allows for better focus on teaching and learning, minimising distractions and interruptions.

This Special Report will help address mobile phone separation anxiety and provide guidance on supporting your child's wellbeing during this transition period. We hope you take a moment to reflect on the information offered, and as always, we welcome your feedback. If this raises any concerns for you, a loved one or the wellbeing of your child, please consider seeking medical or professional help.


