This month on SchoolTV - Neurodiversity

Neurodiversity emphasises the natural variation in how an individual's brain functions and how they perceive and interact with the world, leading to diverse ways of learning and communicating. While most young people are neurotypical, some exhibit variations in brain development, such as ADHD, autism or dyslexia, making them neurodivergent.

Embracing neurodiversity involves accepting, celebrating, and supporting neurodivergent children and adolescents without attempting to change or treat their differences. Using respectful language, challenging unhelpful attitudes, avoiding assumptions, and actively promoting inclusivity can help embrace neurodiversity effectively.

Acknowledging the unique ways neurodiverse young people do things and then adapting tasks and activities to ensure their full participation will encourage them to develop strategies that feel natural to them. It will help improve their mental health, wellbeing and sense of self. By recognising and nurturing their strengths, parents and caregivers can contribute to building an inclusive and compassionate society where all young people can thrive.

Learning more about neurodiversity, equips caregivers with insights into effective communication techniques, educational strategies, and parenting approaches tailored to the specific needs of their neurodivergent child. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition, and we always welcome your feedback.

# Year 12 Personalised WACE Exam Timetables

On September 5, students will be able to download a Personalised Exam Timetable for the Year 12 ATAR exams. This will show students when all their individual exams are scheduled and the venues and times. Most exams are at Applecross SHS, but not all of them. Students need to bring this document to each exam. **I would encourage this timetable to be printed off and several copies to be placed in various places in your home as well as in parents' calendars.**

Unfortunately, on rare occasions, students misread the timetable and fail to attend an exam. There is no opportunity to re-sit the exam if it is missed. It is a very stressful time for all people involved, particularly the students, so your help in ensuring they are ready for the exams will greatly benefit your child.

## Year 12 Final Weeks Schedule

Our Year 12 students are rapidly approaching the end of their secondary schooling at Applecross SHS. Please take the time to read the schedule of events and KEY Dates for your child below. Attendance at school for ATAR students is not optional and they are all expected to be present for all scheduled classes. This is critical to them maintaining momentum leading up to their WACE exams.

The most successful students maintain a rigorous schedule/ timetable once their formal classes have ended. The time to 'rest' and take their foot off the accelerator is after their final WACE exam in November. Year 12 General and VET students are NOT required to attend classes in Term 4, however, this is only if they have completed all tasks to ensure they achieve their WACE. Students are invited and highly encouraged to attend the final whole school Year 12 Awards assembly on Wednesday 18 October during Period 1. Parents are also invited to attend this event. 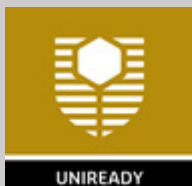

## UniReady 2023 Option for Year 11 Students

During week 9 (Monday 11 September) we will be holding an information session during SMART period for all Year 11 students regarding the Curtin Unready course for Year 12 students. UniReady is the alternative entry course for entry into Curtin University at the end of Year 12.

This is a program that students do as part of their Year 12 program, which allows students who are borderline or below the required 70 ATAR entry score for university entrance to enter Curtin and potentially Murdoch and Edith Cowan without studying a minimum of 4 ATAR courses in Year 12. The course is designed to give students the skills required for university success without the pressure and high workload associated with doing a full ATAR load. This is still a demanding course and should not be seen as an easy way to get into university. It is an alternative way of getting there that does not have the same work load and stress as the ATAR option.



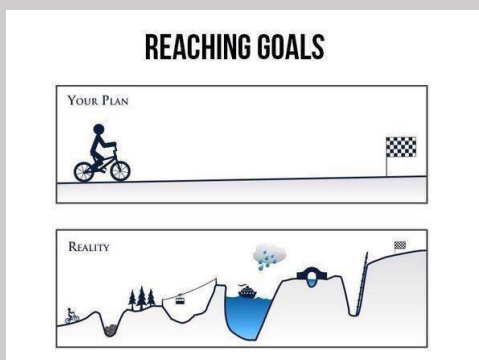
It does not get you into all courses as it will give the student the equivalent of a 70 ATAR. There are, however, a wide range of courses, available to students following the successful completion of these courses will allow them entry into university. Students will complete four courses in Year 12, one which must be English, and the other two courses will be UniReady. This is an excellent option for students who are not quite at the required level to do well in ATAR courses but do have the desire and potential to enter university.

In fact, many of our current Year 12 UniReady students have already received their offers to their preferred courses at Curtin for 2024.

Students were given some information and they have also had the PPT sent home via CONNECT to look through with their parents. The Parent Information evening is scheduled for Wednesday 13 September for all parents of interested students. A formal booking invitation will be sent to you via SEQTA next week. During the presentation we will be providing you with the application criteria for students required to qualify for the UniReady program.

### Year 11 Students: Applications for course changes and dropping courses for Year 12

Students studying 4 or more ATAR courses MAY be eligible to drop a subject for Year 12. All students wishing to 'drop' a course, must complete an application form (available from me personally) and have a discussion on the best option for them and what will enable them to achieve their academic success. This process will begin in Term 4 and students will be notified when this will be possible. For some students, they may need to wait until they have completed their exams to determine their most appropriate course of action.

## Welcome to my last edition of Eyes on VET.

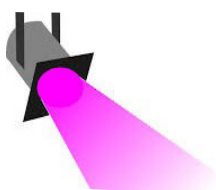

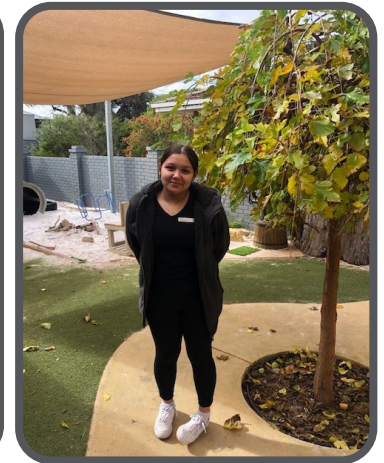
