The fact that we were chosen for this visit is testimony to the quality of the music program that Tim and the Music staff have developed.

Minister's Visit

The Hon Dr Tony Buti MLA, Minister for Education, and Ms Kim Giddens MLA, Member for Bateman, visited the school on Wednesday 30th August. Our guests were welcomed by our School Captains; Sienna Pettman; Vania Gharari and Aaron Bollman. The Minister visited our Art Rooms where he spoke to Year 12 student Nancy Lim and saw some of her artwork. He also visited Ms Sweetman's Year 9 class and interacted with a number of students. The Minister was then served coffee in our new Hospitality Café (The Green Apple) where he spoke with Ms Henderson and some of our Year 12 budding baristas. A number of representatives of our School Board; P&C and Student Leaders then met with the Minister to discuss the school's need for additional permanent buildings in the next few years.

I wish to thank our Board Chair, Andrew Dwyer and other members of the Board who have been working with Ms Kim Giddens MLA to plan for the future growth of the school.

Planning for 2024

Planning for next year is well underway with timetabling and lots of staff recruitment processes having already occurred. We expect to have an additional six transportable classrooms in place for the beginning of the new school year with a Hospitality Room and a Design and Technology room to be delivered during the coming school holidays. A staff committee is also working on developing a prioritised list of minor works to ensure that we are maximising the use of storage and office space. We will also continue to work with our student representatives to improve facilities and amenities for our students.

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Unwell Students | Health Centre Notice

A large number of students have been presenting to the Health Centre unwell with gastrointestinal symptoms, colds and flus. As a result, we have been sending many students home (including as early as period 1) as they have been too unwell to stay at school.

At times, unwell students have been waiting for an extended period in the sick bay, waiting to be picked up or for parental/guardian consent to go home. If you or a relative are listed as an Emergency Contact, please ensure you are contactable and available to pick your child up from school, should they be unwell. If it is difficult for you to leave work to pick up your child, then (if possible) please make sure the school has a contact person who can do this. This will help prevent the spread of germs and in turn ensure student and staff health, wellbeing, and attendance. Should changes need to be made to your child's emergency contacts or you are unavailable (for example, if you are away for work or holidays), please ensure other arrangements are made and inform the administration office.



If you are aware that your child is unwell prior to coming to school, please do not send them to school until they have recovered. This includes days that your child has an assessment. If you or your child are concerned about missing a test, please be reassured that the Assessment Policy states "when a student returns from any absence, they will be required to complete the assessment". Please contact the respective teacher regarding any concerns with completing assessments and absences. You can see more about the assessment policy below, which is also on the school website.

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Year 12 MOCK and WACE Exams

Year 12 MOCK Exams

Exams for Year 12 students commence in Week 10 this term (Wednesday 20 September). Please note that attendance at all exams is compulsory and a critical component of their final stages of their Academic journey.

WACE Exams

As you are probably aware by now, students have access to their Personalised Written Exam Timetables as well as their Personalised External Practical Exam Timetable. This must be brought to every exam. Each year we have a small number of students who make organisational mistakes when sitting exams such as forgetting their timetable or failing to attend an exam due to mixing up times and dates or venues. This is a very serious mistake to make because there are no resits available.

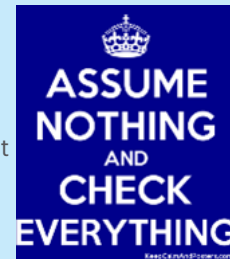
Misreading a timetable is not an acceptable reason for missing an exam. In addition, students who are not sitting a minimum of four exams start to think about not sitting the exam. **This cannot occur under any circumstances. Failure to sit the final WACE exam will result in no credit towards their WACE for having completed the course (Please see statement below in italics). They will have sat in the class for a whole school year for no reason other than learning the content.**

It is essential that all students sit all exams and give their best effort. If a student is identified as a non-trier because they have clearly put in minimal effort, the statement below from the School Curriculum and Standards Authority also applies.

If students do not sit any WACE ATAR course examination and do not have an approved Sickness/Misadventure Application for that course, the pair of units completed in that year will not contribute towards any of the WACE requirements. Students who do not sit the WACE exam will not have a course mark or grade recorded on their WASSA, nor will they receive a report for that ATAR course.

I would like to encourage the following strategies to ensure students attend their exams at the correct time and minimise potential last minute stresses:

- Parents/Guardians have all their child's exams in whatever sort of calendar, or diary that they use with the appropriate reminders in place. Ensuring students attend on the right day is a team effort.
- Give yourself plenty of time to get to your exams. Arrive early. You don't need to hang around with the other students if that doesn't suit you. There are plenty of quiet places. Few things are more stressful for students than being late to exams.
- A small number of students have exams that are not at Applecross ie Languages and EALD. Please ensure you know what school you are going to and where it is. I strongly recommend visiting the school before the exam.
- All [Japanese Practical Exams](#) are held at Penrhos College in Como and the [French Practical Exams](#) are at Shenton College.
- The [Practical DRAMA](#) exams are all held at [Canning College](#)
- A copy of the exam timetable is kept in multiple places such as on the fridge where it will be seen regularly
- Students have an additional copy of their timetable in their bag that they bring to the exam. This is not their main copy; it is a backup. Always bring the same bag so the timetable is there. ATAR exams are not a fashion parade. The one bag allows you to be confident that you always have a copy.
- Make sure your bag is packed the night before. All you should have to do in the morning is pick your bag up and leave.
- If for some reason, you forget your copy of the timetable, don't panic. Come to the Main Reception or Student Services and we will give you another one.



All students in Physical Education Studies, French, Japanese and Drama have a Personalised Practical Exam timetable - These MUST be taken with them to their PRACTICAL exams. Please make sure you are all aware of the location, time and date of these exams. They cannot be rescheduled if you miss them!

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Absence from WACE Exams

Any student who does not sit a WACE exam for any reason must fill out a Sickness Misadventure Form available from the school. **There are no exceptions.** Without this they will not be given credit for having completed the course (see above). These need to be approved by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA). A medical absence MUST be covered by a medical certificate. A note from a parent is not acceptable. Welcome to another edition of Eyes on VET.

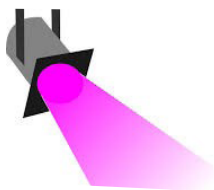
Year 10 students have been given the opportunity to participate in Work Experience for one week in Week 9 next term as part of 'Leap Week', and it has been fantastic to meet lots of Year 10 students who have been dropping their Employer Placement forms into the VET Office for processing. At this stage, 98 students have secured placements for work experience. Forms were due in to the VET Office on Monday, 4 September.

Work Experience encourages students to engage in employment in a particular field of personal interest. The students gain invaluable skills and experience from participating in this opportunity, and it is beneficial to be able to include this work in a Resume for casual employment and TAFE or Alternative Entry to University applications in the future. It can also assist students in making decisions about their future pathways.

Year 10 and 11 VET Connect students have completed their applications for a variety of external courses in 2024 through both TAFE and private Registered Training Organisations. Students are now eagerly waiting to hear the outcomes of their applications, which should be early next term.

Our four Year 11 Hospitality classes assisted the Student Services team in raising over \$1500 for the Wear It Purple organisation. They served Rainbow Cupcakes to a swarm of customers at recess and lunch. A fantastic effort by all involved.

Year 12 VET Connect students are in their final weeks of schooling as they know it, and many students have already started making plans for life after school... this is such an exciting time for students. TAFE applications for full-time study in 2024 are OPEN and close on 15 December. Keep an eye on Connect for more information.



Spotlight on the SCSA VET Awards

Twelve of our Year 12 VET students have been nominated for the SCSA VET Awards, which recognises outstanding achievement in VET. Students eligible for this award will have completed, by the end of Year 12, a nationally recognised VET qualification to a minimum of AQF level II in one of nine industry areas.

Nominated students are also required to have completed at least two unit equivalents of Workplace Learning in an industry area that is related to the VET qualification. Students must meet selection criteria, and the process requires statements from the student, their workplace representative and the VET Manager. I wish all of our nominated students the best of luck and hope that they make it to the next stage which involves an interview with a VET Awards Selection Panel.

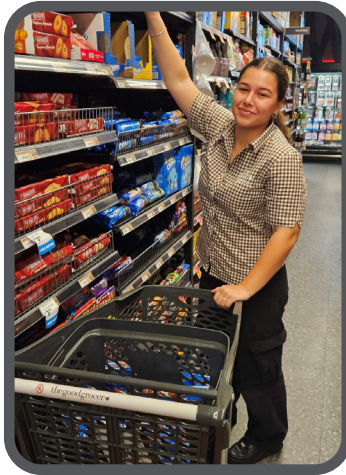

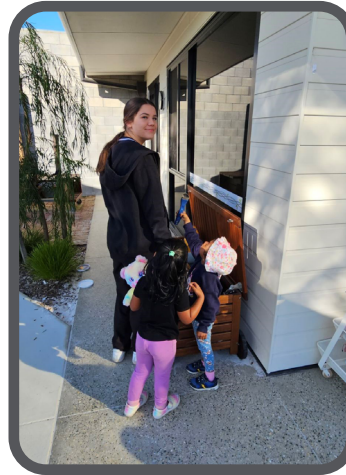
