Update from the Principal continued

Road Safety - Riseley Street

Unfortunately, there have been regular occurrences in recent months where school-crossing wardens have not been available at either location on Riseley Street in the mornings or afternoons. WA Police manage these crossings and simply have been unable to recruit sufficient staff, with no backfill available when wardens are unwell.

We have been warning students about the risks of crossing Riseley Street and have told them that they should still be crossing at the designated crossing location rather than places where visibility is restricted to motorists. We would appreciate it if this message could be reinforced by parents.

The Traffic Wardens State Management Unit (6274 8731) organise recruitment and can provide training for any parents or community members interested in being trained as relief warden. Our local MLA (Kim Giddens) is happy to provide rooms at her office for training.

Keeping students safe online

Recent world events have led to some concerns regarding distressing online content finding its way onto student screens and devices. It's normal for staff, parents and carers to be concerned about what our children may see, so during this time we recognise that keeping families free from harm on the internet is very important.

Biennial National School Surveys

Due to these surveys being postponed in many schools because of COVID-19 disruptions, the mandatory years have now changed from even to odd years. This means that schools that completed the surveys in 2022 (which includes Applecross SHS) will have to administer the survey again in 2023 to bring all schools back in line.

The late notification of this change means that we will miss doing the survey with Year 12 students, but plan to do the survey with the other groups of stakeholders (staff, students and parents) around mid-November (Weeks 5 or 6).

The surveys consist of 20 standard nationally consistent questions with the capacity for schools to have additional questions for each of the three groups of stakeholders (staff, students and parents). We will be working with stakeholders to adjust the optional questions and encourage parents to complete these surveys when you receive them in November.

OLNA Year 9 2023

Some students in Year 9 are about to sit the OLNA. OLNA stands for the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment, which some students will use to demonstrate they have achieved the required standard of literacy and numeracy for their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). The OLNA has three components – writing, reading and numeracy.

Writing Test: Monday 23rd & Tuesday 24th October
Reading Test: Wednesday 25th October
Numeracy Test: Thursday 26th October
Catch-up Tests: Friday 27th October

Please ensure you and your child are familiar with their individual test requirements, dates, times and locations. Should your child become unwell in the first week of testing, the Reading and Numeracy components can be rescheduled to the second week of the testing window. However, please note that the Writing component can only be completed in the first two days of the testing window.

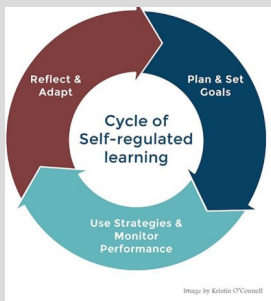
Learning To Learn

The Theory

Setting goals:

- creates intention and motivation that empowers students,

Goal setting can help students build competence, establish autonomy, cultivate interest in learning, and alter their perceptions of their own abilities. (Usher & Kober, 2012)

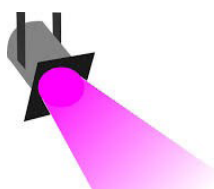
School-Based Traineeship - **Seth Mack**

Since my last update, seven of our students who were nominated for the SCSA VET Awards were successful in making it to the next stage of the VET Awards process, which required an interview last week with a panel of judges. The students provided feedback about their interviews and all found it to be a very rewarding process. They really enjoyed sharing their VET journey, which made them realise just how much they have achieved in the VET program for their senior school studies. Following these interviews, students may be awarded Certificates of Excellence in VET, and if ranked first in the selection process for a VET Certificate of Excellence, they may be awarded a VET Exhibition Award in their industry area. A maximum of one Exhibition is awarded in each VET industry area.

Students awarded a VET Exhibition then proceed to the final stage of the VET Awards process, and could be awarded the Beazley Medal: VET, which is awarded to the eligible student who has demonstrated the most outstanding overall performance in a VET Certificate II or higher and in their other WACE achievements. Best wishes to all of these very successful students! I look forward to seeing the final outcomes of these awards in January.

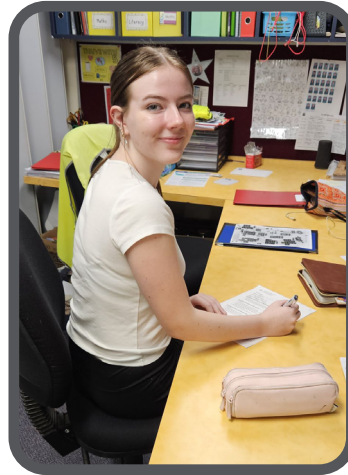
