Applecross SHS works with our six network schools to ensure that the transition to high school is a major focus for us all, it is one of our three network priority areas. I would like to acknowledge some of the excellent work that has been occurring in two aspects of this important area.

Academic Extension Testing 2024

The success of our academic extensions and academic enrichment programs (see below) has resulted in a 50% increase in applications over the last two years.

The average 2022 ATAR score for a student who had been in all four of the Year 10 AE classes was a tremendous 96.1

The popularity of our AA and AE programs has seen us test 160 students this year, we have since offered 76 places to AA programs and 88 into AE, (some crossovers occurred hence the odd numbers). Our acceptance rate is now 98% an increase of over 30% in some of our recent years.

The program coordinators have noticed a marked increase in test scores and next year's cohort looks very promising. This is a huge vote of confidence from our local community.



Transition Activities

Our transition to high school program is so successful, that Statewide Services are monitoring us as an example of best practice. I would like to acknowledge, Ms Morrison, Mrs Dickson, Mrs Sloan & Mr Saxton amongst others who have all placed a lot of time and effort into this well-oiled process.

Our program this year involves the following:

- visits to all six network schools from staff and former primary school students to discuss high school life
- a handover program where primary school Year 6 teachers are invited to high school to share best practices and provide us with pertinent student performance data
- a Future Leaders program inviting potential student counsellors to undergo our training and preparation program
- an Amazing Race Adventure for students needing some additional support moving to high school
- classroom observation in our Network School to gather data and useful information on students needing additional support
- two full school acclimatization days towards the end of Term 4 for all incoming students
- a Parent Information session on what to expect in high school
- two 'Big Days In' at the start of 2024, where students are prepared and trained for success in high school. They will meet their Year 10 student mentors during this program

The National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing period will fall between **Wednesday 13th of March – Monday 25th March 2024**.

In preparation for the official testing period, **Practice Tests will take place in Term 1, Week 5, Monday 26th February**. All Year 7 and 9 students will formally complete one practice test, the Omnibus (Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy), in the same fashion as the official NAPLAN testing period.

It is important that your child attends school and participates in these assessments. Although NAPLAN is not directly linked to school reports, it provides a valuable 'snapshot' of academic performance and development. The achievement of minimum benchmarks in Literacy and Numeracy is linked to Secondary School graduation, as well as TAFE and university entrance.

Applecross SHS students will not be permitted to complete the NAPLAN Online on a Chromebook or tablet device. Additionally, Android devices are not supported by NAPLAN Online. Students are also required to bring in their own plug-in headphones (no Bluetooth headphones).

Vaping: A Growing Concern for Schools and Families

Year 11 VET Connect students have a terrific opportunity to use the exam break to catch up on any work they may have been behind in from school or their external course, while some have taken advantage of this extra time off to pick up more Workplace Learning to increase their total hours for the year. All hours completed in the Workplace Learning program will show on the Year 12 Statement of Results, so this total can be very impressive for alternative university entry, TAFE or other external courses, as well as for employment and apprenticeship opportunities.

With only 3.5 weeks left of Year 11, I will be working closely with the VET Connect students to check that they are all set to start any new courses in Year 12 and Workplace Learning in Week 1 next year. Year 11 VET Connect students need to make decisions about their Workplace Learning plans for next year... some students may choose to continue with their current placements, while others are keen to take the opportunity to gain some work experience in a new industry area, or same industry, but with a new employer. Either way, students have all been given an Employer Details Form which they need to return to the VET Office when they return from the exam free period, on Wednesday, 22 November (Week 7).

External course offerings from TAFE and Private RTOs have been coming through over the past two weeks, and it has been fabulous to see so many students gain places into programs of their choice.

Congratulations to Seth Mack (P2C) on winning the Apprentice Employment Network WA School Based Trainee of the Year Award. Seth also received a special recognition award sponsored by Karrinyup Rotary Club. The awards were celebrated at a formal event at Burswood on the Swan on Friday evening, 20 October. Spotlight on Year 10 Work Experience in Week 9

Just a reminder that Year 10 students all have the opportunity to complete a week of work experience in Week 9. Work Experience encourages students to engage in employment in a particular field of personal interest. The students gain invaluable skills and experience from participating in this opportunity, and it is beneficial to be able to include this work in a Resume for casual employment and TAFE or Alternative Entry to University applications in the

future. It can also assist students in making decisions about their future pathways.

Students can still collect information about Year 10 work experience from the VET Office or from Connect. Employer details for placements need to be returned to the VET Office ASAP for processing. To date, 159 students have submitted their forms. Site checks and paperwork for all these workplaces have commenced.

I look forward to seeing these students take up this great opportunity.
