Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we farewell our Year 12s, we also welcome our 2024 Year 7 students and their parents. Over 330 students and their parents attended Orientation Day activities either last week and will do so again on Monday, 4th December.









Change to Format of Parent-Teacher Meetings for 2024

Following extensive feedback from the school community, the School Board has endorsed a proposal for Applecross SHS to conduct whole-day closures (with no normal timetable operating) for two parent-teacher days – one Face-to-Face (Tuesday 30th April 10:30 am — 6:30 pm); and one online (Wednesday 8th May 10:30 am-5:00 pm). In 2023 Face-to-Face meetings were completely booked out and some families missed out on interviews altogether. The extended time for the new format of Parent-Teacher Meetings increases the number of meetings slots for parents.

The School Board has endorsed this proposal on the following basis:

- It maintains two different delivery methods (Face to Face and Webex).
- It increases both the timeframe and the number of available bookings for parents.
- A range of schools have been consulted on how they run interview days. The model adopted is similar to that at other large schools such as Rossmoyne, Willetton, and John Curtin.
- · Concurrent parent information sessions will also be occurring in the Auditorium on the Face-to-Face meeting day.
- The teaching time lost on these two days is balanced out by the loss of teaching time due to public holidays and School Development Days on Mondays and Fridays.

Just in time for Christmas, our Year 12 Construction students recently fabricated three dog kennels, which are ready for sale and perfect for small to medium sized dogs.

These are incredibly robust kennels. Stud wall frame construction is at the foundation of product strength and is externally lined with feature cladding. The roof is detachable to facilitate cleaning and is covered with Colorbond mini flute sheeting. The bargeboard timber is Spotted Gum and finished with an exterior grade varnish to complement the exterior acrylic colour scheme.

Kennel accessibility is easy via the side door opening, and good air circulation prevents odour buildup and maintains a healthy environment.

Finishing touches include:

- Colorbond roof and wall flashings.
- A hardwood door sill.
- Rubber internal matting for comfort and cleaning
- Timber feet elevate the kennel and maximise airflow.

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Chevron Focus Environment Photography Competition by Nicole Ryan | Visual Arts and Design Teacher


